New London Homeless Hospitality Center Update

Members of the TantorGives! Committee recently visited the New London Homeless Hospitality Center, a 40-bed shelter that also contains a 5-bed, 24-hour care section for those facing health crises. Over 600 guests are sheltered at the Center every year. The Center supports those facing homelessness by helping them acquire the basic, but essential, needs to find permanent housing and become independent; whether this be a new driver's license, treatment for addiction, or a bus ticket home.

TantorGives! will be making a monetary donation to help continue to build on the success that the Center has so far. Additionally, during the one year anniversary celebration of TantorGives! we will be holding a basket raffle, with the proceeds going towards the New London Homeless Hospitality Center.



School Supply Drive Results

With your contributions, and a \$500 donation from TantorGives!, we were able to provide a ton of school supplies to students in Old Saybrook, Westbrook, and Norwich. Overall, it is estimated that the Tantor community was able to donate: 45 packs of pencils, 24 boxes of color pencils, 12 packs of highlighters, 60 glue sticks, 6 3-ring binders, 17 packs of filler paper, 20 boxes of markers, 40 boxes of crayons, 32 packs of pens, 19 packs of erasers, 49 composition books, 118 folders, 22 rulers, 2 pairs of scissors, 5 protractors, 3 compasses, 8 packs of index cards, 3 sharpeners, 65 notebooks, 17 lunch bags, 17 bottles of hand sanitizer, 4 packs of travel size tissues, and 4 hooded sweatshirts.

Paying it Forward

I've been a supporter of the **UConn School of Business Entrepreneurship Bootcamp for Disabled Veterans** for several years. This program is funded by donations and gives post-9/11 service-disabled veterans the training and help needed to start their own businesses. They receive a year's worth of online courses and participate in a 10 day "bootcamp" where professionals volunteer to train them on running a small-business and help them to write a business and marketing plan. At the end of the bootcamp they actually launch their business.

On October 7th, I gave a presentation to the class of 2015 on "IT Decisions for the Entrepreneur" filled with real-world advice on how to use IT in a small-business. I represented Tantor and our IT team. It was extremely well-received and they were very grateful to all of us (Tantor and our IT team) for the training. I want to give special thanks to my fellow IT colleagues who provided their own insights based on years of experience in the IT field. When I told them that I was doing this presentation for these veterans, I got the enthusiastic response "I'd love to help them, let me know what I can do!" I mentioned this to the veterans and you should have seen the smiles :-)

The veteran/entrepreneurs I spoke to represent the US Marine Corps, Army, Navy and Air Force. There were twenty men, five women and all have exemplary service records and service-related disabilities. One class member was awarded the Purple Heart, one Legion of Merit and three were decorated for valor in combat. Several had visible evidence of very serious wounds. These vets are dedicated to each other: a common theme of their business plans was to assist or fund other veterans in need.

Thanks to Tantor and TantorGives! for giving me the time to do this and to my colleagues for sharing their knowledge and experience. As a veteran myself I am grateful for the opportunity to help out my brothers and sisters.
